Update from the President

Your AAUS Board of Directors has recently returned from a very productive semiannual BOD meeting in Denver, CO; a big thanks go out to the Downtown Denver Aquarium for donating space. At the meeting the board unanimously approved an initiative to develop and implement a strategic plan to identify the priorities that will guide the Academy over the next 3-5 years. We will be asking members for input through questionnaires and requests for information and opinions over the next few months. Please contribute your time by responding; member input will be invaluable to the Board as we move ahead. Also, feel free to contact Heather Fletcher in the office or one of the board members if you have questions about the process.

Along with many other issues we discussed, some priorities identified by the board included increasing fundraising for the AAUS Foundation to provide a long-term funding base for scholarships and enhancing Symposia; improving the web-based statistics logging system to enhance function and ease of use; increasing the opportunities available to AAUS members and DSOs through the AAUS Certification Program/ ITI Initiative; moving the accreditation process out of development and into the implementation phase; and developing a DSO resource page to allow sharing of teaching and other materials through a member's-only web interface.
